Police Commissioner's Message

This document presents the 2018/2019 Policing Plan of the Mauritius Police Force (MPF). It reaffirms the relevance of the current strategic direction 2015-2018, the goal of which is to enhance the quality of life of our people by preserving the public peace, enforcing the law, ensuring a safer environment and focusing on service excellence.

In fact, this Plan ensures that we maintain our policing priorities and crime control strategies implemented since the past three years. The reason is that it is now that we are starting to reap the fruits of our investment. Besides the policing issues emerging, warrant a strengthening of the foundation that has been laid as opposed to adopting a totally new line of approach. While we are proud of the positive strides Police have made in many areas, such as the decreasing trend in property crimes and huge seizures of drugs, we are working with more zeal to address other issues such as road safety. 




2. LARCENY AGGRAVATING CIRCUMSTANCES

4. ROAD TRAFFIC CONTRAVENTIONS




5. (i) COMMUNITY POLICING FORUMS

6. POLICE HOTLINE (148)


