We intend to operate in partnership with all stakeholders, particularly the community in the combat against drugs.

The drug scourge is a pandemic issue affecting the world on a scale which is compromising the security and wellbeing of the society.

Our country is no exception to the drugs issue. Drugs have become a national concern, thus requiring actions from all stakeholders to bring under control their proliferation.

In this respect, ADSU is fighting drugs on two fronts: Supply and Demand sides. On the Supply side ADSU carries out operations islandwide intensively, targeting drug networks and focusing on drug dealing cases. It is worthy of note that ADSU adopts a zero tolerance policy in the fight against drugs. Hence, arrests range from drug dealing to cases of simple

On the demand front, the ADSU Education Cell conducts sensitization and awareness in primary and secondary schools, youth clubs, sites of works and community groups throughout the country to prevent people falling prey to the drug trap.

With its resources and commitment, ADSU is determined to accentuate its combat against illicit drugs. Although the challenge is tough, the unflinching support of the Government and the higher command of the Mauritius Police Force will be instrumental in meeting set targets.

We are committed to achieve the Force Priorities through efficient and effective response with a high degree of commitment. In addition we also endeavour to achieve our Branch objectives:

DISRUPTING THE DRUG SUPPLY NETWORK

- Increasing the number of successful drug operations (arrest, seizures, etc..) by 5%.
