Foreword




My first Policing Plan as Commissioner of Police sets out how we will protect our country and meet our national lead force responsibilities.

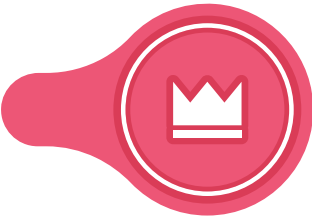

Priority 1: Combating Drug Trafficking & Substance Abuse

Disrupt the drug networks and reduce supply and demand of dangerous drugs.

Methodology	Targets
Tighten surveillance at Port, Airport and known Sea Routes to reduce entry of dangerous drugs in the territory.	<div><input type="checkbox"/> Increase the number of checks along sea routes, port and airport by 3%.</div>
Reinforce intelligence/information sharing among domestic, regional and international intelligence agencies.	<div><input type="checkbox"/> Increase detection rate of drug dealing/trafficking along drug axes by 2%.</div> <div><input type="checkbox"/> Increase arrests and seizure of drugs by 5%.</div>
Conduct intelligence led operations targeting drug traffickers/dealers and facilitators.	<div><input type="checkbox"/> Increase the number of cannabis uprooting operations by 5%.</div>
Educate and sensitise the vulnerable groups especially the youth to prevent them from becoming easy prey of the drug spree.	<div><input type="checkbox"/> Increase the number of multi-agency intelligence driven operations by 3%.</div> <div><input type="checkbox"/> Increase information sharing with domestic, regional & international agencies by 2%.</div>

Priority 2:

Policing Gender-Based Violence



Protect the vulnerables (elderly, women and children) from all sort of violence.

Methodology	Targets
Conduct aggressive sensitisation for the prevention of violence against elderly, women and children.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">❑ <i>Increase community base initiatives (community forum, handhold, door-to-door, social outreach, etc.) with the vulnerable groups by 5%.</i>❑ <i>Visit elderly person/s living alone on a fortnightly basis.</i>❑ <i>Increase victim support initiatives by 5%.</i>❑ <i>Ensure Police response to request within 15 mins.</i>❑ <i>Increase early successful prosecution of perpetrators by 5%.</i>
Strengthen partnership with internal and external stakeholders for prompt intervention into Domestic Violence cases.	
Set up of special desk at Police Counters to afford personalised service to the vulnerable especially elderly.	
Conduct tailor made training for improving capacity building of Front-liners for prompt responds to request for Police assistance in cases of gender-based violence.

Priority 3: Reducing Property Crimes

To prevent larcenies and re-victimisation.

Methodology	Targets
Revamp the concept of community policing to ensure greater participation of the community and relevant stakeholders.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❑ <i>Increase participation of the community in policing forum by 3% including the enrolment of new community leaders.</i>
Ensure the protection of elderly persons especially during end of months where they become more prone to theft on the streets and their homes.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❑ <i>Develop other community policing initiatives such as door-to-door to ensure community reassurance.</i>
Enrolling tourist enterprises, representatives in the protection of tourists from victimisation.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❑ <i>Increase the number of engagements with representatives from the tourism sector on security of tourists by 5 %.</i>
Monitor suspects and associates linked to property crimes and ensure early arrest and prompt presentation before court.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❑ <i>Increase the number of checks/searches of suspicious characters/ vehicles at places of tourists attraction by 5 %.</i>
Cause disruption of market for stolen goods through aggressive and dissuasive sensitisations of the general public to encourage them not to buy stolen property.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ❑ <i>Subject prolific/ high suspects, HCs under Police supervisions particularly those with a history of drug addiction to daily checks.</i> ❑ <i>Increase checks on premises of suspicious dealers in jewellery/ scrap metal yards/ street vendors by 3%.</i>

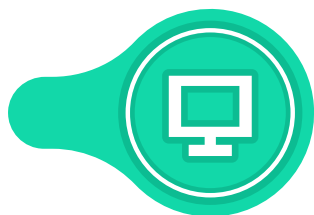
Priority 4:

Improve Road Safety



Reduce road fatalities and serious road accidents.

Methodology	Targets
Targeting rogue drivers/riders involved in drink/drug driving, dangerous, careless and inconsiderate driving, driving without holding appropriate license.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">❑ <i>Increase number of contraventions related to speeding, drink driving, driving under the influence of dangerous drugs, dangerous, careless & inconsiderate driving by 3%.</i>❑ <i>Increase the number of contraventions for failing to wear seatbelts, and fasten protective helmets by 5%.</i>❑ <i>Increase the number of contraventions for inefficient silencer, taking part in illegal rally by 5%.</i>❑ <i>Increase VCPs / Road Block/ speed checks/ alcohol/drug test in accident prone areas by 5%.</i>
Cracking down on drivers/riders and passengers adopting risky behaviours such failing to wear seat belt, protective helmets, etc.	
Cracking down on motorcyclists engaged in illegal rallies.	
Adopting intensity road safety education.	
Increase patrols and enforcement.	
Speeding up enquiry into road accident.	
Speeding up cases of contravenes who default fine payment.	
Targeted policing re light rail & level crossing.

Protect citizens from cyber-related offences.

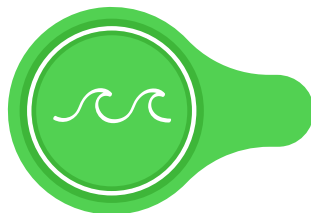

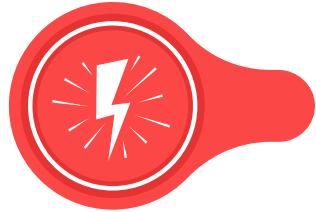
